

Enclosed with this letter is the defendants' portion of the Pre-Trial Order in the above captioned case. The defendants followed the case management plan and timely delivered to the plaintiff a Pre-Trial Order complete in its body, exhibits, and witnesses. Plaintiff, however, failed to provide a complete portion of his sections of the Pre-Trial Order. The plaintiff initially delivered a copy of his exhibits without the body of the Pre-Trial Order. As counsel for the defendants, we informed plaintiff that this was the incorrect form and that it was his obligation to conform the order in a manner consistent with the court rules. The plaintiff delivered an additional draft Pre-Trial Order that remained inconsistent with the rules. Defendants, again, informed the plaintiff that the order was not in proper form. Counsel also informed the plaintiff that without the appropriate revisions, we would not sign the Joint Pre-Trial Order. Plaintiff refused to make any revisions to the order he drafted and filed only a partial Pre-Trial Order.
