PETITION FOR DAMAGES FOR DEFAMATION OF CHARACTER

NOW UNTO COURT comes Plaintiff, Robert Edwin Burns, in proper person, who asserts the following:

1.

That he is a person of the full age of majority and resides in the Parish of East Baton Rouge, State of Louisiana.

2.

Made Defendant in this petition for damages is:

ANNA DOW, a major resident and domiciliary of the Parish of East Baton Rouge, State of Louisiana.

3.

On July 26, 2010, auctioneer Barbara Bonnette caused a fax letter to be forwarded to the LALB Chairman James Kenneth Comer, Jr. in care of the La. Auctioneer [sic] License [sic Board (hereinafter referred to as the "Letter") whose office is located within the Parish of East Baton Rouge. That faxed letter, which was <u>unsigned</u> by Ms. Bonnette, was received by the LALB office on Tuesday, July 27, 2010 at 10:04 p.m. A copy of the Letter is attached hereto and made a part hereof as Exhibit "P-1."

4.

Ms. Sandy Edmonds, LALB Executive Assistant, relayed at the August 2, 2010

LALB Board Meeting that the fax was observed on the office fax machine on the morning of Wednesday, July 28, 2010. Ms. Bonnette was then purportedly contacted by LALB officials and told that the complaint needed to be on her letterhead and signed.

Ms. Bonnette complied with that request and submitted a second fax identical to the first except for being signed and on her company's letterhead. That fax was sent by Ms.

Bonnette directly to then LALB Chairman James Kenneth Comer on Thursday, July 29,

2010 at 11:56 a.m. A copy of the Letter is attached hereto and made a part hereof as Exhibit "P-2."

5.

On Thursday, July 29, 2010, at 10:44 a.m., Petitioner received an email from Ms. Edmonds relaying, via email attachments, that a certified letter had been dated and mailed to Petitioner the previous day, Wednesday, July 28, 2010 (the day **BEFORE** anyone at the LALB had received a <u>signed</u> complaint) relaying that an item entailing Petitioner's character had been placed on the agenda of the August 2, 2010 LALB Board Meeting and informing Petitioner of a potential request to go into Executive Session and Petitioner's right to insist that the discussion take place in an open forum.

6.

On Thursday, July 29, 2010 at 2:32 p.m., Petitioner requested via email to Ms. Edmonds that he be provided with a copy of any written complaint prior to the scheduled LALB meeting on Monday, August 2, 2010.

7.

On Thursday, July 29, 2010 at 3:38 p.m., then LALB Chairman James Kenneth Comer, Jr., in apparent response to Petitioner's request, faxed a copy of Exhibit P-2 to the LALB office. Ms. Edmonds then submitted via email a copy of the complaint to Petitioner on Thursday, July 29, 2010 at 4:13 p.m.

8.

Petitioner received the actual certified letter itself and accepted same on Friday, July 30, 2010. A copy of the Letter as well as the envelope in which it was mailed is attached hereto and made a part hereof as Exhibit "P-3."

9.

Ms. Edmonds, in her email to Petitioner of Thursday, July 29, 2010 at 4:13 p.m., stated: "If you don't object, I would like to forward it [the complaint] to the entire board prior to the meeting. Please let me know." Petitioner responded, via email sent on Friday, July 30, 2010 at 9:33 a.m.: "It is my preference for the complaint not to be disseminated; however, I am neither the author nor the recipient of the complaint, so those parties will have to make that determination regarding your request."

Defendant Anna Dow, LALB Legal Counsel, stated at the August 2, 2010 LALB meeting that Ms. Bonnette's complaint was against "the Board," notwithstanding the entirety of the complaint referencing purported actions on the part of Petitioner. Ms. Bonnette's complaint <u>clearly</u> failed to fall under the jurisdiction of the LALB and should instead be adjudicated, as the complaint <u>itself</u> referenced, in a civil court of law. Petitioner made this fact abundantly clear in an email sent to then LALB Chairman Comer and Defendant Dow as well as Executive Assistant Edmonds on Sunday, August 1, 2010 at 9:44 a.m. A copy of that email is attached hereto and made a part hereof as Exhibit "P-4."

11.

Petitioner further addressed the points referenced in Ms. Bonnette's letter via response on his letterhead to then LALB Chairman Comer (delivered via fax), and Defendant Dow (delivered via email) as well as to Executive Assistant Edmonds (delivered via email) dated Sunday, August 1, 2010. A copy of that letter is attached hereto and made a part hereof as Exhibit "P-5."

12.

At the August 2, 2010 LALB meeting, the email and letter referenced above in which Petitioner bent over backwards to alert then Chairman Comer and Defendant Dow that the complaint accusations were untrue, baseless, and did not belong under the jurisdiction of the LALB notwithstanding, then Chairman Comer, after first conferring with Defendant Dow regarding handling the matter (and in particular reading the complaint into the record, to which Defendant Dow responded "Um huh"), authorized the dissemination of Ms. Bonnette's Letter to third parties (namely Board Members and certain audience members in attendance at the meeting). That dissemination of the Letter on the part of then Chairman Comer upon the authorization by Defendant Dow to third parties, namely LALB Board Members and certain audience members, constitutes unprivileged publication of the Letter for defamation of character purposes.

13.

On information and belief. Ms. Bonnette is the author of the Letter.

The second version of the Letter is written on the letterhead of Defendant, Bonnette Auction Company, L. L. C. by Ms. Bonnette.

15

The letter contains scurrilous accusations against Petitioner, Robert Edwin Burns, which are unsupported by fact or law.

16.

Though the content of the Letter speaks for itself, Petitioner is accused of "disrupting legislative sessions, using the boards [sic] name...."

17.

Further, the Letter accuses Petitioner of "....harassing our company...."

18.

The Letter also accuses Petitioner "...of stalking..." Ms. Bonnette.

19.

Additionally, as a further accusation, the Letter states that Petitioner "...gives the whole industry a black eye."

20.

It is believed that these accusations were authorized for dissemination by Defendant Dow in a bad faith attempt to discredit Petitioner, both personally and professionally, and that the authorization for dissemination given by Defendant Dow was done so with actual malice.

21.

Then Chairman Comer and Defendant Dow readily admitted, on tape, at the LALB meeting of Monday, August 2, 2010 that they had made <u>no effort whatsoever</u> to corroborate Ms. Bonnette's claims (both stating, "We don't have any proof."). In fact, Defendant Dow stated at that meeting, on tape: "The situation is that I must <u>assume</u> that she [Defendant Bonnette] must have something. Otherwise, she would not be sending this letter." Ms. Dow had a duty as the Board's independent legal counsel to investigate the allegations contained in the letter but instead chose to acquiesce to the item being placed on the LALB agenda (an admission she made during the August 2, 2010 meeting) under, as has been clearly conveyed in the timeline of these pleadings,

emergency-rush conditions. Despite repeated requests on the part of Petitioner for follow-up findings by the LALB and/or Ms. Dow to corroborate Ms. Bonnette's accusations, as of the date of the filing of this petition (nearly one year after the Board Meeting at which all of Ms. Bonnette's scurrilous accusations against Petitioner were publicly aired in detail), no such corroboration has been forthcoming either from the LALB or Defendant Dow. Ms. Dow was well aware that Petitioner's stand on shill bidding, an illegal practice in Louisiana (as in all licensing-law states) was immensely unpopular with numerous auctioneers throughout the state. Upon information and belief, it was these auctioneers' zeal, including that of Chairman Comer who vigorously opposed laws to strengthen shill bidding penalties in Louisiana, which motivated them to discredit Petitioner at that August 2, 2010 meeting. Rather than making any effort whatsoever to perform her duty as an independent legal counsel regarding the matter, Ms. Dow chose instead to essentially team up with these auctioneers and, in fact, criticized Petitioner during the meeting for making his stand on the issue of shill bidding openly known to the public via extensive information regarding it on his website.

22.

Rep. John E. Guinn, R-Jennings, close friends of then Chairman Comer, attended the August 2, 2010 LALB meeting. Rep. Guinn previously confronted petitioner immediately after a meeting of the House Committee on the Administration of Criminal Justice on May 18, 2010. Petitioner had just completed testimony in favor of HB 1439 by Rep. Baldone, D-Houma, which would criminalize the practice of shill bidding at auctions. In the hallway just outside of Committee Room 6, Rep. Guinn, accompanied by approximately 10 like-minded auctioneers, all of whom opposed the bill, became very belligerent with Petitioner, resorting to the use of profanity and uttering phrases regarding defendant's character. As a result, Petitioner filed a police report with Capitol Police on Monday, May 24, 2010. A copy of that police report, which was accepted by Lieutenant Ray Alexander and subsequently delivered by him to House Speaker Jim Tucker, is attached hereto and made a part hereof as Exhibit "P-6."

23.

Twenty-eight (28) days subsequent to the August 2, 2010 LALB meeting which, as previously referenced, Rep. Guinn attended, Rep. Guinn drafted a letter to Governor

Bobby Jindal's Special Assistant, Jonathan Ringo, relaying that numerous auctioneers throughout Louisiana had requested the removal of Petitioner from the LALB. A copy of Rep. Guinn's letter, which was dated August 30, 2010, is attached hereto and made a part hereof as Exhibit "P-7."

As a result of Rep. Guinn's letter dated August 30, 2010, combined with the scurrilous falsehoods conveyed at the August 2, 2010 LALB meeting, Jonathan Ringo telephoned Petitioner on Wednesday, September 8, 2010 requesting his resignation from the LALB. Petitioner declined to provide the requested resignation and instead drafted a letter to Mr. Ringo dated September 8, 2010. A copy of Petitioner's letter to Mr. Ringo is attached hereto and made a part hereof as Exhibit "P-8."

Mr. Ringo provided an email to Petitioner dated Monday, September 13, 2010 relaying that Governor Jindal terminated Petitioner's services on the LALB effective Friday, September 10, 2010. A copy of Mr. Ringo's email to Petitioner is attached hereto and made a part hereof as Exhibit "P-9."

24.

As the said accusations of Ms. Bonnette's letter are untrue, the authorization for dissemination provided by Defendant Dow has caused damage to the personal and professional reputation and character of Petitioner, Robert Edwin Burns. Upon information and belief, it is further believed that the false and malicious accusations, combined with Rep. Guinn's actions of drafting a letter to Governor Jindal's Special Assistant, Jonathan Ringo, believed to be based on those false and scurrilous accusations, are believed to likely have played a significant role in Governor Jindal's decision to remove Petitioner Robert Edwin Burns as a Member of the LALB effective Friday, September 10, 2010. Therefore, Defendant Dow's action of authorizing the placement of the item on the LALB agenda as well as the authorization she provided to then Chairman Comer to disseminate the letter when she had a duty to first point out that the item was inappropriate to be heard by the LALB given that Ms. Bonnette's complaint entailed alleged conduct on the part of Petitioner, not the Board and a second duty to investigate the accusations contained in the letter for truthfulness. Instead, then Chairman Comer, relying upon the guidance of LALB Legal Counsel and Defendant Dow, opted to disseminate the letter. In so doing, Defendant Dow permitted an act

entailing the dissemination of false, scurrilous, and malicious untruths regarding Petitioner which, in turn, resulted in substantial harm to the personal character and reputation of Petitioner.

WHEREFORE, petitioner, ROBERT EDWIN BURNS, prays that Defendant, ANNA DOW be duly served with a copy of this petition, and cited to appear and answer same and, after all legal delays and due proceedings had, there be a judgment herein in favor of petitioner, ROBERT EDWIN BURNS, and against defendant ANNA DOW awarding him all damages for the prosecution of this action, including costs associated with the action and for any and all other relief, legal or equitable, which may be available under the premise of this cause.

Dear Mr. Burns:

This letter is to notify you that an agenda item has been added for the August 2, 2010, meeting of the Louisiana Auctioneers Licensing Board which may result in a request for an executive session. This notice is required pursuant to LSA-R.S. 42:6.1, which states that:

A. A public body may hold an executive session pursuant to R.S. 42:6 for one or more of the following reasons:

(1) Discussion of the character, professional competence, or physical or mental health of a person, provided that such person is notified in writing at least twenty-four hours before the meeting and that such person may require that such discussion be held at an open meeting, and provided that nothing in this Subsection shall permit an executive session for discussion of the appointment of a person to a public body. In cases of extraordinary emergency, written notice to such person shall not be required; however, the public body shall give such notice as it deems appropriate and circumstances permit.

I would ask that you notify the Board prior to 9 a.m. on Monday, August 2, 2010, whether you wish the discussion of the agenda item to be held in the open meeting.

I'm assuming that, at some point between now and noon tomorrow, I will be informed what specific licensing law violation I have committed for which Monday's discussion of me is transpiring. Otherwise, the proper venue for adjudication of liable/slander allegations is, as Ms. Bonnette asserts, via civil action in court. Further, since all of Ms. Bonnette's allegations are stated as objections to acts I have performed as a private citizen and, in not one instance does she indicate I am acting in any capacity as a Board Member, I am at a loss as to how Ms. Dow and Mr. James Kenneth Comer Jr. have categorized tomorrow's agenda item as a "complaint against the Board regarding Robert Burns." In reading her "complaint," I do not see one instance in which she references the LALB as having committed any act whatsoever for which a "complaint against the Board" can be explicitly or implicitly derived.

Since the certified letter I received appears to have been coordinated by an attorney (presumably our Legal Counsel, Anna Dow) as it references specific open meetings executive session requirements (a welcome departure from January 26, 2009 when no such formality was exercised by our legal counsel in a similar instance involving character assassinations against me), I would assume she thoroughly reviewed Ms. Bonnette's complaint and gave a "green light" for the certified letter's composition and advised Mr. Comer to sign it and you to send it on out in the mail. She can correct that assumption should it be incorrect at tomorrow's meeting.

Again, I assume both Ms. Dow and Mr. James Kenneth Comer, Jr. have thoroughly reviewed, contemplated, analyzed, investigated, and viewed this "complaint against the Board" in order to justify placing it on Monday's agenda, so I will expect significant corroborating evidence to be in the possession of these two individuals. I feel certain that Ms. Dow and Mr. James Kenneth Comer, Jr. felt <u>VERY</u> strongly that these allegations had <u>significant</u> merit, thus justifying them taking the authoritative step they did in placing the item on the agenda, particularly under such "emergency rush" conditions to which I have alluded in previous emails.

I am abundantly certain that Ms. Anna Dow and/or Mr. James Kenneth Comer, Jr. possess far more documentation than that which I have been supplied, and I look forward to us all having the opportunity to review that extensive documentation tomorrow. Such documentation would include, but certainly not be limited to, the following:

- Dates of Bonnette auctions at which I attended,
- Specific auction personnel having executed sworn affidavits stating exactly how, and through what means, they were "harassed,"
- The specific words I uttered at any Bonnette auctions fortifying any allegations of "harassment,"
- Actual audio recording of my words from an ASF audio file to fortify Ms. Bonnette's assertion that such recording contain "libel and slander" (Aside: perhaps Ms. Dow and/or Mr. James Kenneth Comer, Jr. may wish to educate Ms. Bonnette that only one, slander, can be proven via an audio recording since the other, libel, should be in written form).
- Written evidence from Governor Jindal's staff, or the Governor himself, expressing displeasure with my job performance as an LALB member,
- Written statements from the NAA evidencing them viewing me with disdain and a "black eye" to the industry,
- Any further written evidence of how I have given the "entire industry a black eye,"

- Evidence to suggest that the NAA has experienced a "change of heart" in backing off the article they published in the June, 2010 issue of <u>Auctioneer</u> magazine, in which J. P. King's legal counsel, Mr. Steve Proffitt, blasted shill bidding in words making my characterizations of the practice seem tame by comparison (article attached for reference written permission for duplication expressly granted by Mr. Proffitt). Otherwise, may I assume Ms. Bonnette also asserts that Mr. Profitt, a well-respected attorney who commands VERY, VERY, VERY high speaking fees for continuing education seminars due to his unparalleled expertise in the auction business, is also giving the auction industry a "black eye"?
- For Specific printed pages from any Auction Sells Fast webpages which name Ms. Bonnette BY NAME or that assert there is anything more than an allegation on the part of Representative Baldone that he believes shill bidding was deployed at a Thibodaux auction (you can inform Ms. Bonnette that Thibodaux has no "e" in it among the many other grammatical errors, capitalization errors, etc. that exist in her clearly well-thought-out and well-composed "complaint against the Board" letter). The fact Rep. Baldone did so is obviously a matter of clear public record, and I invite all parties involved in this complaint soap opera episode to review the testimony of both the April 19, 2010 Commerce Committee LA House videos or May 18, 2010 Criminal Justice videos (at which Ms. Bonnette HERSELF takes credit for the Thibodaux auction).
- Any evidence from either the Louisiana House or Senate leadership evidencing me having "disrupted legislative sessions." If memory recalls me correctly, and I know full well it does, I don't recall Chairman Wooten ever interrupting me and saying any of my testimony was "not relevant," but I certainly recall such a statement being made on his part regarding the complainant, Ms. Bonnette.

So, in summation, I am certain these two individuals have supplied you with (or certainly will supply us all with) documentation which justifies their actions in such a fashion that constitutes clear-cut, unequivocal, evidence demonstrating a basis for a justifiable belief that Ms. Bonnette's allegations are true. Otherwise, I feel certain that these two individuals would possess sufficient common sense that would have dictated postponement of that agenda item until the September meeting at a time when they would be in possession of more corroborating evidence such as that referenced above.

I anxiously await feedback from either of these two individuals (or from you on their behalf since I know Chairman Comer lacks email capability) regarding the foregoing.

On another point, I do want to state that, as with any American, I have the same First Amendment right to free speech, http://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Freedom_of_speech_in_the_United_States. I realize Chairman James Kenneth Comer, Jr. differs from me philosophically on many issues regarding the auction industry, which is his right and what makes our country uniquely great. While I don't agree with many of his positions, I fully respect his right to hold those beliefs and have never infringed on Chairman James Kenneth Comer, Jr.'s right to hold and express his beliefs regarding the auction industry. Within that constitution right, I am free to express my sentiments regarding the practice of shill bidding (an illegal act in the state of Louisiana) in as forceful of manner as I so choose provided I do not defame anyone's character. Since Ms. Bonnette alleges that I have in fact defamed her character, I'm sure she has provided evidence such as I reference above and that Ms. Dow and Mr. James Kenneth Comer Jr. have thoroughly reviewed, analyzed, and investigated her corroborating evidence. I certainly hope that Chairman James Kenneth Comer Jr. is not under any misguided belief that he, or any other auctioneer, is on a misguided mission to attempt to stifle my First Amendment Right. Since Ms. Dow is an attorney, I feel certain she would not acquiesce to such an attempt to stifle that right, particularly given the capacity she holds on the Board, which is to uphold the legality of auctions vs. stifling any auctioneer's First Amendment Right to, as Mr. Proffitt has encouraged ALL auctioneers to do (see attached article), "strongly denounce them" (referencing shill bidding practices by auctioneers).

Lastly, just for the record, any discussion of my character at Monday's LALB meeting shall take place in an open forum.

I certainly hope you and the two individuals referenced above are enjoying a wonderful weekend.

Dear Ms. Edmonds:

Regarding the complaint filed "against the Board regarding Robert Burns" as categorized in the August 2, 2010 agenda, with said agenda having now been disseminated out to all Board members and prominently posted for the world to see on the central Louisiana.gov depository, let me state a few quick facts formally for the record:

- 1. The last Bonnette auction I attended was 282 days ago.
- 2. Since I obtained my auctioneer's license, I itemize an approximate recap of local area real estate auctions I've attended by auctioneer since that time:

ne of these other auctioneers have made any
being "stalked."

- 3. I first met Ms. Bonnette in late 2003 after she attempted two unsuccessful auctions of a Briarwood Estates home here in Baton Rouge (no bidders attended either of her two auctions). She said she was willing to "let you have it," (meaning me take over the listing), so I executed a co-op listing with Ms. Bonnette, got the property sold at \$205,000 for our mutual client, Martin Schott (Bankruptcy Trustee of the Middle District of LA), and Ms. Bonnette, through her broker, received a \$4,100 commission on the transaction (I provide a copy of the HUD-1 settlement statement and my fax to her alerting her to expect same dated 2/27/04).
- 4. The property referenced above subsequently became the subject of a lawsuit filed in Rehibition in mid-2006. Though neither Ms. Bonnette nor I were name in the suit, we both received subpoenas for documents from plaintiff attorney Coley West in January of 2007. I include a copy of that subpoena.
- 5. Ms. Bonnette called me and relayed she "had no records." I informed her I had plenty of records and would supply them to Mr. West, for which she expressed extreme thanks. Mr. West expressed frustration that Ms. Bonnette had no records, but I personally appealed to him not to file a complaint with the Louisiana Real Estate Commission. Had Mr. West done so, she could have been fined

substantially since real estate agents and brokers are required to maintain records for five years.

- 6. I would submit that if I were adversarial to Ms. Bonnette as she describes in her complaint, I would have not appealed on her behalf for no complaint to be filed with the LREC.
- 7. Also pertaining to the auction referenced above, I had to provide a 3 ½ hour deposition in Mr. West's office with four attorneys grueling over details about inspection dates, termite tunnels, etc. Ms. Bonnette was spared that ordeal and expressed appreciation for the fact she didn't have to drive to Baton Rouge and endure it. I can provide a copy of the deposition if the LALB office desires it. I also point out that the litigation remains unresolved to this day.
- 8. At one of the approximate five (5) auctions I attended of Ms. Bonnette in late October of 2007, Ms. Bonnette publicly acknowledged my presence and even gave me a free plug for a property I was auctioning the next week off Bluebonnet Boulevard, which I subsequently got sold for \$390,000. I expressed sincere appreciation for her generous gesture which, in hindsight, seems bizarre if I was "stalking" and "harassing" any of her staff. I wish to also add that, at another of Ms. Bonnette's auctions I attended, Mr. Steele, our former investigator, was there the entire time, so I assume Mr. Steele has executed a sworn affidavit attesting to the fact I harassed Ms. Bonnette's staff and appeared to be "stalking" her.
- 9. At one of the other Bonnette auctions I attended approximately 14 months ago, I openly complimented Ms. Bonnette at the January, 2010 LALB meeting in expressing my opposition to her co-listing partner, Mr. Troy Leppard, receiving a refund of his licensing fee. I stated Ms. Bonnette and Mr. Leppard hit a "home run" and made a "fortune" at that auction, so I was disheartened that we were refunding Mr. Leppard's licensing fee. Nevertheless, the motion passed 3-2 with me and Mr. Phillips in opposition and Ms. Steinkamp casting the deciding vote to refund the licensing fee.
- 10. Regarding the above auction, Dave Gilmore had asked me to attend and just give a general report (a favor he often does for me for New Orleans auctions and I have even attended a J. P. King and Williams and Williams auction in New Orleans when he was out of town so he could know how they turned out). I called him within minutes of the conclusion of that auction, which my cell phone records will corroborate, and relayed that Ms. Bonnette had "hit a home run." Dave stated to me that he was glad for her and wished he'd pursued that auction more aggressively as he had previously spoken with the seller, David Gaines, regarding auctioning the property a few years prior to her auction. I have no doubt whatsoever that Mr. Gilmore will attest to that in writing.
- 11. I pose one question which I want answered by Ms. Bonnette and I'm sure our legal counsel and Mr. Comer are bound to have posed of her by now. If the last auction I attended that she conducted was 282 days ago, why are we only now hearing of all these problems I have been purporting to cause?



12. I make the observation that Ms. Bonnette's complaint letter is dated July 26, 2010, a mere seven days after Auction Sells Fast launched its "No Shill Guarantee" program. Coincidence?

These are all just facts I find to be relevant to tomorrow's proceeding.

Any and all documents or things¹ related in any way to the house located at 13522 Betti Helen Place, Baton Rouge, La (the "Residence"), which was part of the estate in the bankruptcy proceeding entitled *In re: Perrone, Bernard & Julie*, Case No. 02-1234 on the docket of the United States Bankruptcy court for the Middle District of Louisiana.
- 2. Any and all documents or things related in any way to the sale or proposed sale of the Residence through public auction, private sale or otherwise by Barbara Bonnette, Bonnette Auction Company, Robert Burns or Santangelo Enterprises and the inspection, appraisal or condition of the Residence or photographs thereof.
- 3. To the extent not already covered, any and all documents or things related in any way to Glenn Christy or Denice Christy.



May 24, 2010:

On Tuesday, May 18, 2010, I testified before the House Committee on the Administration of Criminal Justice in favor of HB 1439 by Rep. Baldone which would criminalize the practice of utilizing shills, cappers, etc., to artificially inflate an auction bid (the practice is presently illegal but is deemed only a misdemeanor with a capped fine of \$500).

Upon my exit from Committee Room 6 at approximately 11:00 a.m., I was confronted by approximately 10 auctioneers, two of whom chose to be quite vocal with me regarding my testimony (those confronting me were in opposition to the bill). By far the most aggressive of those auctioneers in terms of confrontation was Rep. John E. Guinn.

Upon confronting me, Rep. Guinn stated, "You're nothing but a sack of shit and you can go straight to hell." I responded to Rep. Guinn that he was conducting himself in a most unprofessional manner. He then got within an inch of my face and inquired "How so?" I responded that he'd just referred to me as a "sack of s-h-i-t [spelled out]," to which he began waiving his hands in the air and openly saying, "Ohhhhhh. I used the word 'shit.' I used the word 'shit."

Rep. Guinn then relayed to me I had no idea what it was like to have walked in "his shoes." He then relayed, in a most angry tone, "Let me tell you something. You're all up here Mr. high and mighty with your FBI investigations. You've never had to walk in my shoes. You've never had to go into an auction and know you HAD to get the bid up to put clothes on your kids' backs. Well, I HAVE, and hell yes, I've run up the bid! But I know YOU'VE never been there. You've never walked in my shoes, but I can tell you one thing, your day is coming!"

During Rep. Guinn's tirade, he at one point put his right index finger on my left shoulder in making his point that I had never walked in "his shoes." When combined with the fact he had approximately 10 like-minded auctioneers surrounding him, the environment was one of EXTREME hostility. I told Rep. Guinn that I bid him a good day and proceeded on past the gathering of auctioneers staring at me and exited the building and made my way to my vehicle for my return trip home.

As a result of the above incident, I wish to file formal assault and battery charges against Rep. John E. Guinn.

You further indicated that, "We have conferred extensively with the Inspector General's Office and they concur with seeking your immediate resignation." You also relayed, "Things just aren't working out."

As I ponder how to handle your request, I respectfully ask that you provide a rationale for why my resignation is being sought (beyond a "things just aren't working out"). Upon being provided with more details on the rationale behind your request, I will ponder how I wish to handle the situation.

I am **not** inclined to go back into the pen and be self-euthanized, particularly in light of the vagueness of the rationale for your request and the fact you lacked the decency to call me from an unblocked phone number, which itself is an act I question on the part of any member of Governor Jindal's staff.

Mr. Burns,

I received your letter dated September 8 and I must begin by correcting a quotation you attributed to me. In your letter, you quoted me as saying "we have conferred extensively with the Inspector General's Office and they concur with seeking your immediate resignation." That is not correct and I did not say that. I simply said that we received a letter from the inspector general indicating that there would be no further investigation into your complaint against the board.

The authority to appoint members to the Auctioneers Licensing Board lies solely with the Governor under La R.S. 37:3111. Members of the board serve "at the pleasure of the governor" and thus may be replaced at any time. This email is to inform you that the governor has appointed another person to serve in your place effective Friday, September 10 and your service as a board member is hereby terminated.

This decision has come after receiving requests that a replacement be named from various sources including the Louisiana Auctioneers Association, a sitting state representative, current board staff, other sitting board members and



other interested parties. We thank you for your service, but we are confident that this decision is in the best interest of the Auctioneers Board and the state as a whole.
