Dear Judge Fields:

As you are aware, pursuant to LA CCP 1917, I respectfully requested written reasons for judgment in the above entitled matter via letter to you of April 24, 2014 which was also recorded into the record.

As you are also aware, opposing counsel, Larry S. Bankston, faxed a letter to you dated the next day, Friday, April 25, 2014, objecting to written reasons which I had drafted as a mere convenience to the court. You may recall similarly, as a convenience to the over-burdened court, I also drafted and submitted a judgment on August 1, 2013 entailing a hearing for each side's respective Motions for Summary Judgment, which were heard orally in court on March 25, 2013. You signed that judgment on August 6, 2013. I did so as a convenience to the court even though, at the conclusion of the hearing of March 25, 2013, it was stated that the court would draft the judgment.

It matters not to me whether the court desires to avail itself of the convenience of the reasons I drafted reflective of what I heard in court regarding this court's reasons for its judgment. All I care about is that I obtain written reasons for judgment which, for obvious reasons, I am in need of. Accordingly, even though I made a written request on April 24, 2014 for such reasons and recorded same into the official court record. I submit this letter to reiterate that, pursuant to LA CCP 1917, I respectfully request written reasons for judgment regarding the above entitled matter. I appreciate your time and look forward to receiving those reasons and, should you have any question of me, don't hesitate to give me a call.
