
To The Board of Auctioneers:

I would like to restate my position in regards to the absolute auction in question at the hearing set for Monday, November 5, 2012.

Mr. Henderson and Wilson Auctions indicated that they were able to renegotiate the sale of the property at the absolute auction. I have had 4 different auction companies, Henderson being one of them, in the last 2 1/2 years tell me that an absolute auction, under the law, was absolute meaning the sale had to go to the highest bidder. What is an absolute sale if 2 parties can change the rules of the sale midway and disregard the absolute part of the auction? I was not concerned and didn't think that I, or a representative, should have gone to the auction where the motor home I had on a lien on was being sold because it was an absolute auction and whatever it brought, it would be sold. (Ms. Ward agreed to make up the difference in what it sold for and what was owed) The motorhome at the time had a wholesale value of \$165,000.00 and therefore Mr. Henderson could have sold it the next day and made a huge profit. I don't understand how this could have ever come to pass unless there were collusion between the 2 auctioneers and Ms. Ward. Therefore if this is the case of an absolute sale and it can be altered at the convenience of the auctioneer, then my question is, why do we have absolute sales at all? It carries no credibility and the rules can be changed at any time. I will be very disappointed with the Board unless they rule in my favor to the point that this was collusion between the parties. You normally don't have a fox to guard the hen house and I hope this is not the case in this hearing. I am very sorry I am not able to attend because I would have like to have been there in person to see how this board operates and the credibility it shows to the customer.

I will accept whatever decision you make. I just hope you make the right one and protect the customers you represent.
