7 have an ownership?

9 I didn't want to in particular.

10 Q. But you were still an auctioneer for
11 the new -- the new entity, J.A.H.?

12 A. Uh-huh (affirmative response).

13 Q. And you are going to have to say yes
14 or no because she can't --

15 A. Yes, sir.

16 Q. And do you have to -- in the -- in
17 the auctioneer business, do you have to have a
18 sponsoring company to be a licensed auctioneer,
19 or how does that work?

20 A. Well, you have to have a -- you have
21 to have a company license as well as an
22 auctioneer's license.

23 Q. So does J.A.H. have a company
24 license?

25 A. Yes, sir.
